

Welcome to First Grade!

To start our year off right, it is important that your child continues to read and do math this summer. We begin 1st grade with a brief review, but then we are off and running! The more prepared your child is, the better!

being read to. Reading to your child is one of the most important things you can do to increase vocabulary, comprehension, attention, and focus. Many children at this age are not reading independently. If your child is not, that is ok! Read to them every day. If your child is a stronger reader, great! Keep having them read, but also read to them daily . I am including a list authors and books for reading ideas. Some will be at your child's level, but the majority are for reading to your child. I highly recommend weekly library trips to find lots of new books and build a love of reading. Your librarian will be able to guide you to some amazing books.

I am sending home a **Summer Reading Bingo Game** to help your child keep track of his/her reading. They may color in a square as it is completed. Please remember that you reading to them to complete a box is great! There is also an assignment in the center of the board. Send that and the completed board back to school in the fall for a prize.

For math practice, play games and count and cook. Have your child do puzzles and make patterns. Board games like Chutes and Ladders and Candy Land are wonderful ways to build math skills. Cards games such as Go Fish or Old Maid also provide practice not only with math, but also with social skills. Encourage your child build with legos and blocks. **Most of all, limit screen time.** Children this age should not spend much, if any, time in front of a screen. It hinders their development in many ways.

I am also sending home a <u>Supply List</u> for 1st Grade. Please <u>bring these items</u> to the Elementary Open House in the fall.

When you read to your child daily and provide plenty of math opportunities for them, you are giving them the tools they need to succeed in school and in life \odot . Have a fun summer!
